SEAMS EASY: EFFECTIVE FITTING AND PATTERN ALTERATION

This presentation might just delight your senses! Master Fitter Lorraine Henry will present some very enlightening insights into looking at figures, evaluating what changes should be made and the best way to alter the pattern to meet individual needs. The first part will focus on fitting adjustments for busts and arms. Learn about often overlooked measurements, how and where to take them and how to use them on your patterns. Then practice patterns will be put in your hands, and you will do alterations on them using the newest seam method of pattern alterations. You will learn how doing alterations in a specific order will have the best outcome for a really good fit. The length before width rule and how to apply it! Then our last presentation will be on pants! How to look at and measure for specific curves and how to make pattern adjustments in both measurements and the shape changes that may be needed in the pattern itself! Please bring small scissors, "Scotch" tape, pencil, small ruler and a big smile!
